Engaging in Gospel ministry requires you to relinquish your rights for...

Compensation because of a **compelling** from God that cannot be successfully opposed. (15-18)

<u>Clustering</u> with those like you because of a <u>willingness</u> to do anything shy of sinning to see the lost saved. (19-23)

Complacency because of the need for a disciplined life that stays focused on Christ. (24-27)

Have you ever engaged in an activity that requires serious self-discipline to succeed?

If so, what was it? What were the characteristics of that self-discipline?

What would it look like for you to exercise the same self-discipline in the spiritual realm?
